# 9. Jesus Used the Sword

Teachers' Instructions

#### **OBJECTIVES:**

Jesus is our perfect example. When tempted by Satan, He quoted from the OT scriptures. We need to likewise, know and be able to quote scriptures when we are tempted. Perhaps not aloud, but in our minds, we can say them. If your students are learning the memory verses, they will be helped in time of need.

#### Lesson:

Students will learn how Satan tempted Jesus, and He quoted scriptures. Be sure they understand the importance of reading the Bible and memorizing Bible verses. Be sure you also memorize scriptures.




#### **Crossword Puzzle:**

Younger students can be helped with the crossword puzzle if you use the pages that provide the printed out words. Or you might prefer to print the answers on a chalk board or marker board. Older students should be able to spell the words without assistance.

#### **Word Search:**

The word search is best for older students, as it uses many backward or upside down words.





Jesus was tempted just as we are, but He never sinned. Even so, Jesus quoted scriptures to Satan when He was tempted. The Bible is the sword.

After Jesus was baptized by John, his cousin, He went to the wilderness and did not eat for 40 days. That is hard for us to imagine. You have probably never gone one whole day without eating. We often say, "I'm starving," when we really don't know what it means to be starving.

After the forty days, the devil came to Jesus and told Him to turn stones into bread. Of course, He could have done it! Instead, Jesus quoted scripture, saying, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4).

Then Satan took Jesus to a very high spot on the temple, and tried to get Him to jump off, because God would send angels to save Him so He would not be hurt. Jesus replied, "It is written again, 'You shall not tempt the Lord your God'" (Matt. 4:7).


One last time Satan tried to trick Jesus. He took Him to a high mountain and told Jesus that he, the devil, would give Him all the kingdoms of the world if Jesus would bow down and worship Satan. Jesus said, "Away with you Satan! For it is written, 'You shall worship the Lord you God, and Him only you shall serve'" (Matt. 4:10).

All three times Jesus repeated, "It is written." Jesus knew what the Bible said. We need to learn Bible verses so we will know how we can defeat the devil when we are tempted to sin. After Satan left, the angels came and comforted Him. Christians who learn what the Bible teaches are less likely to sin when they are tempted. We can read Bible verses every day.


# 9. JESUS USED THE SWORD, THE WORD OF GOD, WHEN SATAN TEMPTED HIM

After Jesus was baptized by John, he went into the wilderness and fasted (did not eat) for forty days. Then the "tempter," Satan, went to Jesus. Use the missing words from Matthew 4 in the crossword puzzle:
