A lawyer asked Jesus, "Master, which is the great commandment in the law?"

Jesus replied, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment."

Jesus went on to say, "And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself" (Matt. 22:36-39). We have been learning how we should treat people in the first nine lessons of *Developing Christian Character*.



We will learn about loving God in today's lesson. The love we must have for God is not just the good feeling we have inside when we care about a friend. It isn't the frilly love that goes with sending a valentine. It is so much more.

Turn in your Bibles to 1 John 2:3-5. After you read this passage, talk about what it means to love God. Can anyone in the class quote John 14:15? Jesus was saying the same thing in this verse.



We show God we love Him by obeying the Bible. This means: (1) Do what God says. (2) Do not add to or take away from God's commands. (3) Do not do what God says not to do. (For example, do not steal.)

### To Help Us Understand



"Jeff," Mom called sternly, "Get in here right this minute and put your ball and glove away. Haven't I told you to keep it put up?"

"I'm sorry, Mom," Jeff replied. As he threw the ball into the glove, Jeff asked, "Do we keep God's commandments the same way we keep our things?"

"No, Jeff," Mom answered. "You are thinking about John 14:15, when Jesus said, 'If ye love me, keep my commandments.' Jesus was telling us we show our love for God by obeying what the Bible says."

"Yeah, I think that's what Mrs. Bailey was telling us Wednesday night in class. She said there are three ways we can disobey God. One way is to do bad things God tells us not to do. Like when a person robs a bank. The second way is when we don't do what God tells us to do. That is like when a person stays home from Bible class to watch TV. But I forget the third thing."

Mom helped Jeff remember by saying, "The third way we disobey is when we add to God's Word, or take away from God's Word. The Bible says in Acts 20:7 that the early Christians met on the first day of the week to take communion. But some people try to change that and say we only need to take communion once every three months, or some other number of times."
