9. WORKERS IN THE VINEYARD

Matthew 20:1-16

Jesus told another parable to the Jews. He wanted them to understand that even though the Gentiles became a part of the church (or kingdom) later than they did, the Gentiles would be equally accepted into the kingdom. The same is true of all today, regardless of how old we are when we hear and obey God's Word.


The parable tells about a landowner, who went out to hire workers for his vineyard. The landowner represents God. The vineyard represents the church.

Jesus told how the landowner offered to pay all of the workers a coin that was a fair wage. He hired the first group early in the morning, around 6:00. Then around 9:00 in the morning the landowner went out and hired more workers, also offering them a fair wage. He did the same at noon and 3:00 in the afternoon. All agreed to work for the same amount of money.

Finally at the last hour, 5:00 in the afternoon, the landowner hired one last group of workers. They all quit working at 6:00 in the evening. So some worked 12 hours, some worked 9, others worked 6 and 3 hours and the last group only worked one hour.

The owner had his helper call the workers for the pay. He gave the last group the agreed upon amount, then those who worked 3, 6, 9 and 12 hours also received the same amount. Those who worked all day were upset because they did not get more money. The landowner told them they were paid the agreed upon amount. He was fair to them.

We should all serve God as many years as we can and help teach others. All have an equal chance to be saved at any age.
